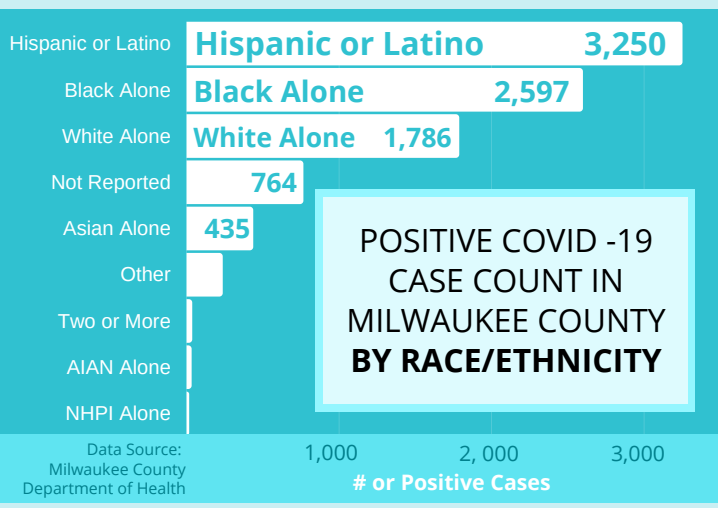

COVID-19 IS GREATLY IMPACTING MINORITIES IN MILWAUKEE COUNTY



15.4% of Milwaukee County's residents are Hispanic or Latino. However, **35.5% of positive COVID-19 cases in Milwaukee County are Hispanic or Latino** residents. Why is there a disproportionate burden of disease among racial and ethnic minority groups in *Milwaukee County*?

The CDC notes that health differences between racial and ethnic groups are often rooted in poorer living conditions, economic status, and lower access to care. In public health emergencies, these conditions can also isolate people from the resources they need to prepare for and respond to outbreaks.

In West Allis, we are working with neighborhood associations, businesses, and local healthcare providers to link people to healthcare services and information that is frequent, clear, and credible.
