RANKING ACTIVITIES BASED RISK OF COVID-19 TRANSMISSION

A media company in Michigan (MLive) spoke to four public health experts to assess the risk various activities pose to spreading the coronavirus. The doctors factored in:

- Whether the activity is inside or outside
- Proximity to others
- Length of potential exposure
- Likelihood of compliance, and personal risk level

WEST ALLIS HEALTH DEPARTMENT RAMPS UP CONTACT TRACING CAPACITY

MILWAUKEE COUNTY KEY HEALTH INDICATOR: CASES
Cases : Trend in percent positive COVID+ PCR tests

- 14 day significantly negative trend OR percent positive ≤ 5% for 14 days (Excellent)

COVID-19 cases continue to increase (↑) in Milwaukee County. The Milwaukee County Key Health Indicator Track Board indicates that Milwaukee County has had a **14 day upward trend for percent positive**. Most recent data from July 5th, 2020 indicates that the 7 Day Average Percentage of Positive Tests in Milwaukee County was **11%**, a 3% increase from the week prior (6/28/2020).

Due to the significant number of cases, the West Allis Health Department **has on-boarded temporary Contact Tracers to include members of the West Allis Fire Department** to assist in COVID-19 contact tracing. This week the Health Department welcomed and trained four new "Tracers". This increased capacity will better support the Health Department's ability to trace and slow the spread of COVID-19 in West Allis and West Milwaukee.
