### STATE AND LOCAL UPDATES

Starting on Saturday, August 1, 2020 and extending until September 28th, 2020, **Wisconsin has issued a statewide face covering mandate.** Face coverings or masks are required to be worn while indoors or in an enclosed space with anyone outside the household or living unit. Face coverings are strongly recommended if you are outdoors and maintaining physical distancing is not possible.

**Why a face covering mandate now?** In the month of July, Wisconsin had a significant increase in community spread and COVID-19 cases with a majority of counties experiencing high COVID-19 activity.


**Wearing face coverings is the simplest way to slow and prevent the spread of COVID-19 virus without requiring people to stay in their homes.**

Exemptions to the mandate include:

- Wisconsin residents under the age of five
- Individuals with health conditions or disabilities that would preclude the wearing of a face covering safely
- Activities such as when an individual is eating, drinking, or swimming
