### KIDS AND CORONAVIRUS: ARE THEY AT RISK?

In West Allis and West Milwaukee **10% of total confirmed COVID-19 cases are from children ages 0 to 17.**

The CDC reports that most COVID-19 infections in children under 18 years are asymptomatic or mild. However, children can develop severe symptoms from the COVID-19 illness and can also spread the virus to family and friends.

Similar to adult populations, the CDC suggests that children with underlying health conditions such as obesity and chronic lung disease are at higher risk for COVID-19-associated hospitalizations.

### COVID & CAMPING DO'S AND DON'TS



With summer drawing to an end, many people might be looking to squeeze one last camping trip in before it gets cold. Here are some tips from the CDC to keep you and your family healthy while camping!

- **DO:** Keep at least 6 feet away from others at the campsite, on trails, and in other areas of the park
- **DO:** Pack hand soap, hand sanitizer (containing at least 60% alcohol) and supplies to clean and disinfect commonly-touched surfaces
- If you choose to camp or hike with people outside your household...
  - **DON'T:** Sleep in the same tent. Sleep in separate tents spaced out by at least 6 feet
  - **DON'T:** Share camping supplies (including food, drinks, and serving containers)
