HOW TO NOTIFY YOUR CLOSE CONTACTS IF YOU ARE POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

In recent weeks the number of COVID-19 cases has increased dramatically both locally and throughout Wisconsin. The growing number of cases has exceeded our health department's ability to investigate and contact trace everyone with COVID-19 or exposed to COVID-19.

Due to the rapid and significant increase in disease activity, prioritization of follow-up will be given to high risk groups that test positive including: people over 65, children, college age students, and individuals connected to a facility outbreak. All others will be contacted as capacity allows.

To those who test positive for COVID-19, we ask that you do the following:

- Stay home and isolate for a minimum of 10 days after symptom onset. If you did not have symptoms and were tested, remain isolated for 10 days from the date of testing. For detailed instructions visit www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/publications/p02627.pdf
- You can return to work or school on day 11 if you meet the established criteria (free of fever and improvement in other symptoms for 24 hours).
- Notify your employer or school.
- **Notify your close contacts** and tell them to quarantine for 14 days from their last date of contact with you. You can notify them directly or through www.tellyourcontacts.org.

WHO IS A CLOSE CONTACT?



Having direct physical contact with someone



Being within 6 feet of someone for 15 minutes total in a day



Living with or spent the night with someone

WHO SHOULD I NOTIFY?

First, determine the **time period** during which you could have exposed others.

- If you have symptoms, you were able to spread COVID-19 starting **two days before your first symptoms started**.
- If you have not had any symptoms, you were able to spread COVID-19 starting **two days before your positive COVID-19 test was taken**.
- Notify anyone with whom you had close contact while able to spread COVID-19.

WHAT DO I TELL MY CLOSE CONTACTS?

“ The CDC and Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) recommends that close contacts quarantine in their home for 14 days, beginning the last day they were exposed to you. This should be done regardless of whether your contact receives a negative test during their quarantine period because they could develop symptoms 2 to 14 days after being exposed. ”
