

Snow Emergency Parking

No person shall park or leave unattended any vehicle of any kind or description upon any emergency thoroughfare during a declared snow emergency except where permitted by posted signs authorized by the Common Council. Such signs shall state "Parking Permitted Between Signs During Snow Emergency" or words of similar effect and shall be posted so as to give reasonable notice of the permitted zone. All vehicles parked in violation of this subsection shall be promptly removed from such emergency thoroughfares immediately at the time when the declared snow emergency takes effect. Emergency thoroughfares shall consist of the major traffic, mass transit and emergency vehicle routes in the City of West Allis.

Snow emergency regulations shall supersede all other overnight parking regulations for the duration of the snow emergency only.

By 10 p.m. of each day during a snow emergency, all vehicles shall park on the side of the street that has even-numbered addresses if it is an even-numbered calendar date or on the side that has odd-numbered addresses if it is an odd-numbered calendar date. Vehicles shall continue to park on the opposite side of the street until 3 p.m. on the following day.

Parking shall be permitted as set forth herein, provided that no other regulations restricting parking as to time, place or manner are violated.

When, in the opinion of the Director of Public Works, snow accumulation on any City street is such that the removal of snow from along the curb becomes necessary or that the movement of vehicular traffic becomes severely impeded because of parked vehicles, the Director is empowered to prohibit the parking of vehicles upon such street or municipal parking lots through the posting of TEMPORARY NO PARKING signs until conditions permit.

Any vehicle parked in violation of this section may be removed, pursuant to Section 10.03(3) of this Code.

Municipal Lot Parking

Parking in the City of West Allis parking lots in the downtown area (7000-7500 blocks of West Greenfield Avenue) requires a permit unless otherwise noted by a sign.



Paying A Parking Ticket

Should you receive a parking ticket, it may be paid at the Records Unit between the hours of 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday-Friday. If you wish to contest a parking ticket, the registered owner must appear in person, with a photo ID at the Records Unit during the above-mentioned hours to set up a court date. All other fines may also be paid at the Records Unit during the above-mentioned hours.

The West Allis Police Department accepts cash, credit and checks for payment of citations (parking, municipal and traffic) in person during normal business hours or online by credit card www.westalliswi.gov/mycityhall.

Parking citations may **NOT** be paid at the City Hall Treasurer's Office. Please follow instructions on the citation, contact 414-302-8080 or visit www.westalliswi.gov for further information.

Night Parking Regulations

A permit or permission is required to park on city streets during the hours of 3 - 6 a.m. Night parking, where permitted, shall be restricted to the even numbered side of the street on those nights with an even calendar date before midnight, and to the odd numbered side of the street on those nights with an odd calendar date before midnight.

There shall be no parking (with or without a permit):

- If parking is not allowed on a certain side of a street, you must park on a different street.
- In violation of **Snow Emergency Regulations**.
- In violation of **Winter Parking Regulations**.

The following motor vehicles are NOT eligible for night parking permits:

- Motor vehicles in excess of 6000 pounds.
- Mobile homes.
- Camping trailers, travel trailers, motorized camping vans and trucks equipped with truck campers.
- Utility trailers and non-motorized vehicles.
- Commercial vehicles.

Permits may be purchased for a variety of periods. No purchased permit may extend beyond the current year. Annual permits expire December 31 each year. Individuals with handicapped placards or plates should contact the WAPD Records Unit for parking regulations.

Special Overnight Parking

You may request overnight permission for one night at www.westalliswi.gov/overnightparkingpermission. No permission will be granted after 3 a.m. When filling out the online form, you will be asked for the address where the vehicle is parked, the vehicle's license plate number and the reason for the request. Special overnight parking permission may be requested a maximum of three times in any calendar month. If there are any problems when requesting permission online, please call the overnight parking line at 414-302-8100.

How To Purchase A Permit

Online - Credit or Debit Card

Visit www.westalliswi.gov/parkingpermit to set up an account.

(Initially, it may take a few minutes to set up an account in the system, but renewing or repurchasing a permit will be easier than before).

- Overnight parking permits may be purchased online by credit or debit card.
- Permit will be mailed within two working days.

In Person - Credit, Debit, Cash, or Check

- Parking permits may be purchased from West Allis Police Department, 11301 W. Lincoln Ave. from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

In Person - Cash or Check Only

- Parking permits may be purchased from West Allis City Hall, 7525 W. Greenfield Ave. from 11:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Cash or check only at this location.

Parking permits are available for purchase on the 22nd of each month prior to the new month and may be used at the time of purchase.

Annual permits are for a calendar year. Quarterly permits are: (Q1) January/February/March, (Q2) April/May/June, (Q3) July/August/September, and (Q4) October/November/December.

IMPORTANT: Overnight parking permits purchased online for the current month will be mailed within two working days. If you do not receive your parking permit by mail within one week of its mailing day, please contact the Police Department Records Unit at 414-302-8080

Be advised that your car may still be ticketed for overnight parking violations until you receive your permit and it is displayed properly in your car's window. Buying a permit online but not displaying the permit in the car's window does not exempt one from violation of the Overnight Parking Regulations. Permits may not be transferred to another vehicle unless authorized by the Records Unit.
